Person must be able to read, write, and communicate clearly in English

Main Responsibilities of the position

The main responsibilities and duties of this position are:

- To supervise the operations of the tramway traffic;
- To supervise the collection of fares from a position which is visible ~~from the front gate~~;
- To allocate the traffic staff duties;
- To allocate the tramcars to be in service subject to the Operations Manager's instructions;
- To ensure that drivers and conductors have the correct equipment, change reserve, first-aid box and mobile phone;
- To arrange for all notices and information boards to be properly located at the start of the day and to arrange for them to be securely stowed at the end of the day;
- Ensure that the Yard gate is kept shut at all times.
- To ensure that the amount of cash held by each conductor is minimised;
- To try to ascertain any unusual or special tramcar loading likely to be expected during the day and to arrange suitable trams and trips;
- To ensure, as far as practicable, that trams arrive and depart at the scheduled times;
- To open the site at the start of operations, monitor the site during operations and secure the site at the close of operations;
- To carry out the Museum's procedures in the event of any incident or accident;
- To inform the Rail Safety Manager and/or a Director in the event of an emergency and to manage the scene until the arrival of emergency services;
- To check that all drivers have completed their inspection sheets; and
- To prepare the necessary paperwork at the end of the day's operation including checking all floats before placing them in the safe.

Qualifications and Experience

Members or Friends:

- Who have reached the age of 21 and may hold a certificate of competency as a tram driver issued by the Museum;
- Who are in good general health to maintain vigilance in conducting the activities required of them and who have passed the required health assessments; and
- Who have completed the requisite training & evaluation process for appointment to the position?
